1. The responses to the questions received by the RFI deadline of April 25, 2022 at 5:00pm are shown below:

Q1: Can you please provide a copy of the incumbent contract and associated pricing?

A1: A copy of the contract with North State Environmental and Addendum No. 1 to the contract will be provided in the forthcoming Addendum.

Q2: Are subs allowed for the Explosives?

A2: The District is not aware of any current explosives and does not anticipate any explosives. However, in the event the District has explosives that are unsafe to transport or handle, a bomb squad would be called out to detonate the material on-site. All other explosives would be handled by the awarded contractor if they were able to provide the services directly or with a subcontractor, but the District reserves the right to contract directly with another firm for services related to explosives.

Q3: Who is the current contractor?

A3: See A1.

Q4: Will you be listing the current contractors pricing?

A4: See A1.

Q5: Should this be quoted as prevailing wage?

A5: The scope of services contemplated in this RFQ&P do not constitute services related public works as defined by Labor Code 1720, and as such do not require prevailing wages.

Q6: I am little confused in regards to the price list, we are to estimate the time to complete?

A6: Please clarify this question. For pricing, contractors shall complete all areas of Proposal Form E Fee and Rate Proposal. For schedule, contractors shall provide responses on Proposal Form D.

Q9: Please provide a copy of the current contract with the current service provider(s).

Q10: What was the annual spend on this contract the last 3 years?

A10: This information will be provided in a future addendum.

Q11: What were the total volumes of each waste stream the last 3 years?

A11: The waste stream volumes over the last two years were dramatically impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic due to staff and students not being on campus. The volumes below reflect pre-pandemic numbers:

Saddleback College (per year)

Oil – 6 drums
Oily water – 50 -100 drums
Antifreeze – 4 drums
Oil filters – 2 drums
Batteries (assorted) ~ 500-1000 lb
Lamps – 4-7 drums of 4ft lamps, 4 small drums of CFL/HID lamps
Tires - ~120
Sharps – 1-2 *drums picked up every other week*
Biohaz – 1-2 *drums picked up every other week*

Organic solvents (halogenated / non-halogenated) (pH range from 0-14) ~200-300 gallons
Inorganic waste (including acids/bases/metals/titration waste/etc) ~300-600 gallons
Organic Solid waste ~ 50 lbs
Inorganic solids ~ 100 lbs
Assorted reactives/oxidizers/smaller labpacks ~ 20-50 lb
Animal specimens – 10-15 drums
Other labpacks ~20-40 small drums

Clarifiers (fine art, auto shops, facilities) – 7 total, pumped twice per year)

Inorganic solids ~ 20 lbs
Assorted reactives/oxidizers/smaller labpacks ~ 10lb
Animal specimens – 15-20 drums
Other labpacks ~10-20 small drums
Flammable rags – 2 drums
Water based paint waste – 20-50 gal
Aerosols ~2 drums

Flammable paints ~5-10 gallons

Clarifiers (fine art, auto shops, facilities) – 7 total, pumped twice per year)

Neutralization pits – 2 (done once per year including replacement of media)

Q12: How many Emergency Responses for service were required in the last 3 years?

A12: Two times.

Q13: Will prevailing wage apply?

A13: See A5.

Q14: For Emergency Response, what is the onsite deployment at the site response time required?

A14: A maximum response time of 3 hours will be required, but a maximum of 2 hours is preferred.

Q15: Who is the current vendor handling this account?

A15: See A1.

Q16: Are you going to send a list of wastes that you have shipped in the past in order to provide a more accurate price list? If not, what if a waste is generated at one of the colleges that we don't have a price on the bid for? How would we get pricing approval or do we just leave it at the site since it isn't on the bid sheet?

A16: See A11.

Q17: Does the non-collusion affidavit need to be notarized?

A17: No.

Q18: Will the award be exclusive, or multi?

A18: The District intends to award contract to only one firm for services District-Wide. However, the District reserves the right to award contract to two firms (one for IVC/ATEP and one for SC) if it is in the District's best interest.

Q19: As opposed to extending or creating additional line items on your price form can we just attach our Er price list?

A19: So long as all of the same items are included in the order provided in the RFQ&P document, firms can provide their pricing lists.

Q20: I know it was stated that you do not currently have radioactive materials on site but in the even you do, would a sub be allowed?

A20: The District is not aware of any current radioactive materials and does not anticipate any radioactive materials. If the awarded contractor is able to provide the services directly or with a subcontractor, the District may choose to work with the awarded contractor. However, in the event the District has radioactive materials that are unsafe to transport or handle, the District reserves the right to contract directly with another firm for such services.
