

Designate April 18, 2023 as

Holocaust Day of Remembrance

HEREAS, more than 70 years have passed since the tragic events we now call the Holocaust transpired in which the dictatorship of Nazi Germany murdered six million Jews as part of a systematic program of genocide known as "The Final Solution of the Jewish Question"; and

WHEREAS, the Holocaust was a tragedy of proportions the world had never witnessed; and

HEREAS, five million others were also murdered by the Nazis because of physical disabilities, sexual orientation, ethnic heritage, and political ideology; and

HEREAS, countless others, still living, who were imprisoned, tortured, and torn from their family members, have, as survivors, struggled for years to overcome the results of that cruel treatment; and

HEREAS, we must be reminded of the reality of the Holocaust's horrors so they will never be repeated; and

HEREAS, each person in the South Orange County community set aside moments of his or her time every year to give remembrance to those who lost their lives in the Holocaust; now, therefore

SE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees and the Chancellor of the South Orange County Community College District do urge faculty, staff and students to observe the day of remembrance for the victims of the Holocaust in an appropriate manner.
