Trustee Brandt reported on her recent attendance at an exciting program sponsored by the Irvine Unified School District which featured Carmen Dragon. 2. The Bridge

In accordance with specifications, at the time of construction the depth of the footings was established by an independent soils engineer. The contractor had estimated the depth to be three feet and, in actuality, soil conditions required nine feet of footings. It is felt that the contractor has some obligation to absorb this expense; however, the problem is excessive. The amount is now being negotiated, and the cost to the District will probably be in the range of \$2,000 to \$4,000.
