SOCCCD has identified several Federal legislative priorities to include, but not limited to the following:



Support Workforce for 21st Century

Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College strive to be on the forefront of workforce and career training, preparing our students for in-demand jobs—whether they are at the start of their career or in the midst of one. SOCCCD has prioritized advocacy for federal policies and programs that provide our colleges with the resources and flexibility needed to create, revitalize, and reimagine programs to fit the needs of Orange County employers.



Veterans

SOCCCD strongly supports our student Veterans. We have prioritized advocacy for federal policies and programs that provide dedicated resources to student veterans, remove barriers to success, and help sustain and expand dedicated services and support centers located at Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College for student veterans.



Basic Needs

Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College students are increasingly confronting challenges in housing, nutrition, transportation, as well as mental and physical health that impact their ability to complete their educational goals. We have prioritized advocacy for federal policies and programs that help students overcome these non-academic barriers and support the wholestudent as they work towards their educational and career goals.



Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)

DACA students and their families are valued members of the Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College communities, and we welcome and support them in their educational pursuits. SOCCCD has prioritized advocacy of federal policies and programs that continue to allow these students to pursue their educational goals without fear of deportation.



Capital Support for Students

SOCCCD has prioritized advocacy for innovative ways to expand course offerings and services on-campus that support a welcoming and conducive learning environment. Such expansions can be accomplished through support of infrastructure, campus amenities, or support for specific program needs at Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College.

2023 STATE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

SOCCCD has identified several State legislative priorities to include, but not limited to the following:



Workforce Development Pipeline

Maintaining partnerships with local industry and workforce development leaders throughout Orange County is vital when advocating for an expansion of opportunities for students who are working to earn degrees or certificates for careers in the trades. SOCCCD has prioritized advocacy for our students to access local apprenticeships, internships, externships, etc., to assist in achieving their career goals. This can be accomplished through California incentives for localities to form partnerships with Irvine Valley College, Saddleback College, and other community colleges throughout the State. This advocacy work helps to open opportunities for students while addressing the skills gap in California.



Dual Enrollment and Career Pathway Opportunities

Dual enrollment has increased significantly over the past decade, and the State continues to view the opportunities, especially California College and Career Access Pathway (CCAP) programs, as sound investments for high school students who want to expedite their pathways to colleges or careers. However, several aspects of dual enrollment needs to be addressed, including transportation, access to course materials, and course scheduling conflicts for high school students. SOCCCD has prioritized advocacy for legislation that supports streamlining CCAPs to increase and expand opportunities for students.



Strengthen Student Support through Financial Aid and Student Housing

While the Cal Grant reform to create the Cal Grant/2 Award was beneficial to providing community college students with needed aid above the cost of tuition and fees, it does not take into consideration the high cost of living for areas like Orange County. Student housing projects similarly are more costly to complete due to the cost of acquiring and developing real estate in Orange County, and thus, provide necessary student housing opportunities. SOCCCD has prioritized advocacy for both the Cal Grant and Cal Grant/2 programs to be increased commensurate to the needs of Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College students who live in Orange County and experience a higher overall cost of attendance.
