

STUDENT FEES

The Board authorizes the following fees:

- I. Enrollment Fee – Each student shall be charged a fee for enrolling in credit courses in the amount established and as required by law.
- II. Health Fee – The District shall charge the State calculated health fee for student health services.
- III. Parking Permit Fee – The District shall charge a fee for parking as approved by the Board.
- IV. Instructional Materials – Students may be required to provide required instructional and other materials for a credit or non-credit course, provided such materials are of continuing value to the student outside the classroom and provided that such materials are not solely or exclusively available from the District. The District shall ensure student access to textbooks and supplemental materials on the first day of class and strengthen student access to other instructional materials before their required use.
- V. Nonresident Tuition and Capital Outlay Fee – Each nonresident student shall be charged a tuition and capital outlay fee for enrolling in credit courses as authorized by law and approved by the Board.
- VI. Student Representation Fee – Students shall be charged a \$2 fee per semester to be used to provide support for student governmental affairs representation. A student may refuse to pay the fee and shall submit such refusal on a form provided by the District to collect fees.
- VII. Student Activities Fee – Students may be charged an optional fee, approved by the Chancellor, for participation in, and/or access to, certain activities.
- VIII. Transcript Fees – The District shall charge a reasonable amount for furnishing copies of any student record to a student or former student. The Chancellor is authorized to establish the fee, which shall not exceed the actual cost of furnishing copies of any student record.

No charge shall be made for furnishing up to two transcripts of students' records,

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or for two verifications of various records.

All student fees charged shall be published in the college catalogs. They may also be provided in other print and electronic publications.

The Chancellor shall establish regulations for the collection, deposit, waiver, refund, and accounting for fees as required by law. The regulations shall ensure those who are exempt from or for whom the fee is waived are properly accounted for and enrolled.
